Why this network? Incentives

- Insufficient awareness of research activities amongst government(-related) research funders hence lack of efficiency and knowledge
- EU thematic strategy for soil protection
 Snowman partners are convinced that soil policies and research should be connected to societal developments, i.e.:
 - sustainable energy and climate
 - sustainable agriculture
 - sustainable water management
 - sustainable urbanization

and thus integrated into multi-sectoral and multidisciplinary approaches including socio-economic aspects



Goals of the SNOWMAN network

- Develop and share relevant knowledge for the sustainable use of soil and groundwater
- Develop a Research Programme based on stakeholders' needs
- Execute the research agenda through calls for projects
- Share:
 - new knowledge from calls (leverage)
 - existing knowledge



History - ERA-Net project

- EU funded ERA-Net project (2003-2009): Sustainable Management of Soil and Groundwater under the Pressure of Soil Pollution and Soil Contamination (7 countries: AT, DE, FR, NL, UK, BE/Flanders, S)
- Achievements:
 - Inventory of research programmes (2004)
 - Vision Paper
 - Research Programme
 - Communication Strategy / Action plans
 - 2 Calls 9 projects M€ 1.77 Snowman contribution
- June 2009 transition to network 'Knowledge for Sustainable Soils'
 - Self sustained and new partners
 - Decision for a 3rd call for projects

Content scope - Research areas

transformation processes on functions of soil

sustainable agricultural production

high yields while maintaining soil fertility

Risk assessment of human health, ecology, risk reduction technologies

socio-economic factors

Impact and influence of socio-economic factors on soil functions



Coordinated Calls



- Derived from the SNOWMAN Research Programme, topics of common interest for a group of Funders, any funding organization in Europe is welcome
- SNOWMAN wants to fund "strategic" research that is applicable for the stakeholders involved
- Findings of SNOWMAN funded projects should be published
- Procedures are updated each time

The Call procedures



Common Activity

International Peer Review (Moderation meeting)

- Call Steering Committee & Call Secretariat

- Acceptance of outputs

- Establishing Research Contracts
- Contract monitoring, payments

Scope of the Calls

Call 2:

- Area management of contamination
- Integration of soil management into spatial planning
- Use of contaminated land for biofuel crop production

Call 3:

- Soil functions and ecosystem services
 - functional soil biodiversity
 - integrating soil ecosystem services in decision making

Sustainable agriculture and forestry

- impact issues of agricultural and forest practices on soil quality
- the role of soil in the adaptation and mitigation of the agriculture and forestry sectors in Europe to climate change

Contamination

- risk assessment and management
- soil filtering capacity
- regional or/and area management

Management of a coordinated Call

- Call Steering Committee (CSC): body responsible on behalf
 of the funding organisations (one representative / funder) for the
 execution of the call from the announcement to the approval of
 the final reports
- Call Coordinator : overall supervision
- Secretariat : single contact point !
 - Collect the contracts, consortium agreements and reports
 - Organise the approval of the reports
- Project boards (PB): in order to assist the CSC for the the transnational monitoring of the projects
 - At least one representative / funder involved in a project
 - The chair is the contact point for the project coordinator



Role of the Project Boards (PB)

- To answer questions and resolve problems raised by the researchers which cannot be solved internally
- To approve any changes to the contracts
- To review progress and final reports
- To advise the funders and the CSC on the acceptability of the project outputs
- Through the PB chair, to present the collective views of the funders to the project coordinators



Watch out!

- Synchronization of all the contracts of the same project :
 - Start date
 - Date for interim report(s)
 - Date for final report
- Consortium agreement should be signed soon!
- A meeting chair of the PB Research coordinator is necessary
- Final payment: only after the delivery and the approval of the transnational outputs.

- Eligibility of costs, payments: to Funders
- Events, changes in work plan or budget, delay :
 - from the researchers to the Project coordinator
 - The project coordinator contact the Secretariat and the chair of the project board
